And our members are an enthusiastic bunch, clapping loudly for each and every shared project. What better ways to encourage, support, and inspire each other? So...new members and others who have yet to ever share at show & tell – give us the chance to be inspired by you. You won't regret it and neither will we.

Minutes of the General Meeting – October 18, 2007

The meeting began with the speaker, Jo Diggs, showing a slide show of her work. Jo also had a trunk show of her beautiful and artful quilts. Her sense of color, depth and proportion was matched only by her sense of humor. What a wonderful speaker!

Following the evening's speaker, President Pat Harrison called the meeting to order at 8: 45pm.

The first order of business was Show and Tell.

Quilt Show: Mary Elizabeth Palumbo has started taking reservations for jobs at the Quilt Show in April. Please get your projects started!

President Pat Harrison stated that the meeting hall criteria will be published in the newsletter and on the web for those members who would like to propose a different meeting place. If anyone should find a building which fits the criteria, please submit the address to the Board for consideration after the first of the year.

Vice President: The Raffle Quilt is completely finished and will be traveling to various shops for display. The first stop will be Betty Combs' quilt shop, [Quilts & More](#). Pictures of the quilt are available as are the tickets. The proceeds from tickets sales should be given to Joan Taylor.

Secretary: Motion made to approve the minutes as printed. Accepted.

Treasurer : General Fund began \$8,880.35 expenses = \$718.87; Income = \$3,329.50. General Fund ending balance = \$11, 490.98; Quilt Show Fund beginning balance = \$7,850.00, Expenses = \$ 34.77; Income = \$1,210.00; ending Balance = \$9,025.23. Accepted.

Historian: The albums from the previous year's guild activities are available.

Hospitality: The sign up sheet for next month's goodies will be passed around, please sign if you will be bringing something to the meeting. Anyone who has a source for coffee donations, please notify hospitality.

Library: Naomi thanked those who purchased magazines this evening and asked if anyone has any suggestions for new books, please see her.

Membership: Norrene reminded everyone about signing in when they first come in. There are 10 people on the waiting list to become members and a couple of people signed up to become associate members.

Publicity/ NEQM : There is a permanent collection of antique quilts at the museum. Ginny has free passes for anyone interested. There will be a free day starting Saturday the 20th and continuing for one Saturday a month until December. Prices have been lowered for membership until the end of year.

For the quilt show, mug mats will be made. Instructions will be in the Nov/Dec newsletter and the [NBOA website](#) or see Ginny. Miniature Quilts are also needed for the quilt show. This is a fund raiser for NEQM. This year, please supply along with your name a little write up about the small quilt that you have entered in the quilt show.

Newsletter: A special, abbreviated email newsletter will be sent on the "in between" months to members with email. It will contain the minutes from the last meeting, the agenda for the next meeting and any time sensitive announcements.

Programs: Jo Diggs will be doing another class. November's class is full: Jan's class still has openings: Feb. 2 day workshop, still openings: March, Sat class is full: May, still some openings. Mr. Wizard will be here in November.

Quilt Show: April 19th & 20th, 2008, Will be held at the North Kingstown High School. Set up is 17th and 18th. Next month the sign up sheets will be available. Registration deadline is Feb. 21st, 2008 for quilts to be entered in the show. Any volunteers from Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, anyone who needs community work credit, could be used in the quilt show. Barbara Fitzsimmons will be the guest lecturer for the Quilt show. She will do readings from her book on Saturday. Also, on Saturday will be the Fashion Show and Sunday the auction for the NEQM. Mary Walter, who works for the museum will be coming to do a presentation.

Quilt-a-thon : Joan Taylor thanked everyone for donations toward the quilt-a-thon that will be held Oct 27, 9: 30am – 3:30pm at the Westminster Unitarian Church.

Special Events: Bus trip to the Gathering November 10, 2007. Possibly a stop at the Quilted Crow. There are presently 47 scheduled for the trip. Any ideas for future trips please see Lynda or Lynda!

Old Business : There will be no more loaning of our Porta-Stands.

New Business : The Niniget Quilt Show will be held at the Westerly Armory. Oct 19th-Oct 21st.

Block of the Month: "Colorful Quilts" book, by Sharyn Craig, was the inspiration for the Raffle quilt. Directions can be obtained from this book. Drawings for the Block of the Month and Door raffles.



10. Located in a safe section of Warwick or East Greenwich, easily & quickly accessible to the highway – preferably within 4-5 miles off Rt 95.
11. Rent cap of no more than \$125 per meeting.
12. Handicapped accessible

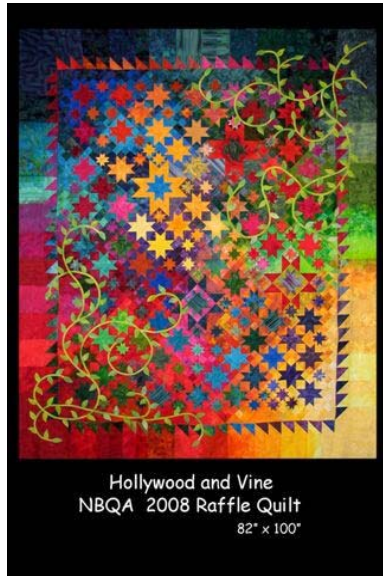

Classroom – Mug Mats ([printable directions also on NBQA website](#))

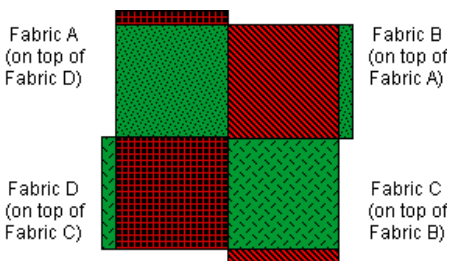
Make some for favors at the Spring 2008 NBQA Quilt Show. Turn them in to Ginny Perry

Cut 5 - 5" squares from fabrics of your choice.

Fold 4 of the squares in half right side out, and press the fold.

Place the remaining fabric square, right side up, on a 5" square of cotton batting and then:

1. Lay one of the folded squares (A) on top of the unfolded square matching raw edges along the top.
2. Lay a second of the folded squares (B) (contrasting if only using 2 different fabrics for these folded rectangles) overlapping the fabric from the first square, and matching raw edges along the right edge.
3. Lay a third of the folded squares (C) (same as the first if only using 2 fabrics) overlapping the fabric from the second square and matching raw edges along the bottom edge.
4. Lay the last of the folded squares (D) (same as the second if you are only using 2 fabrics). Lift the first folded square so that the first fabric is overlapping and only one half of the folded square shows, match raw edges along the left edge. It should look like a four patch:

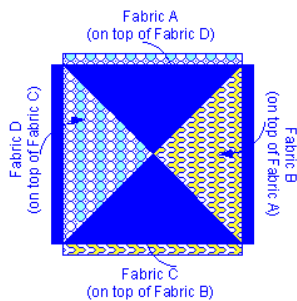


The extension of the fabric is shown for perspective on the way the fabrics are laid out. Do not extend your fabrics.

5. Sew a 1/4" seam along all outer edges. Clip the corners. Through the hole in the middle (this will become very clear when you have a stitched mug mat in front of you) turn the mug mat inside out. Using a point turner (or, alternatively, the point of a pair of scissors), push out the corners.

A Variation

An alternative for the layout of these coasters is to use all of the same measurements shown above, but fold the fabrics in half along the diagonal and layer them the same way except you are matching raw edges on two sides. The finished square will look like a quarter square triangle:



6. Quilt the mug mats.

These directions were adapted from an article by Penny Pennington at eQuilters.com.

NBQA Signature Mug Mats

To make one mug mat you will need:

- 2 – 2" x 5" rectangles of a print or solid cotton fabric
- 1 – 2" x 5" rectangle of muslin or a light cotton fabric
- 1 – 5" square of batting
- 1 – 5" square of backing fabric

Directions:

Sew the three rectangles together, long sides together, with the muslin or light cotton fabric in the middle. Press seams toward colored fabric. This pieced fabric is the top. With a permanent nonacid marker, write "NBQA Quilt Show 2008" along the center strip. Layer the pieces by placing the backing fabric right side down, the batting on top of the backing, and then the top on the batting right side up. Sew around the edges with a 1/4 inch seam, leaving an opening to turn. Trim corners, turn, whip stitch the opening, quilt.

Submission of Entries to the Quilt Show

Date and Times for Submission of Quilts: *Thursday, April 17*

Quilts to be **Judged** must be brought in **between 10 am and noon**, all others 10 to 6:30pm

Date of Judging: *Thursday, April 17* starting at Noon

Date of Set Up: *Thursday, April 17* 9am to 5 pm and *Friday, April 18* from 9 am until finished

Dates of the Quilt Show: *Saturday, April 19* - 10 am to 5 pm; *Sunday, April 20* -10am to 4pm

Submission of Entry Forms: Publication of November 2007 Newsletter to February 21, 2008 that is a Quilt Guild Meeting date. An entry form will be in the Newsletter and on the NBQA website (nbquilts.org). For multiple entries, please copy the form so you have one for each of your entries.

1. Complete and submit an entry form for each item by February 21, 2008.
2. Attach a color photo to each entry form. (Work need not be completed in photo.)
3. Submit entries to Registration Chairperson, Natalie Bielawski at meetings or by mail: 184 East View Ave, Cranston, RI 02920. Please observe the 2/21/08 deadline as much work is involved in preparing the program. Registration questions: 943-5961.
4. Work previously shown at an NBQA show may not be resubmitted unless by invitation. All quilts submitted must be made by NBQA members.
5. If a quilt is from a published pattern or is the result of a class, please acknowledge.
6. Six inch sleeves are required on all quilts except miniatures and small wall hangings.
7. NBQA Quilt Selection Committee reserves the right to accept or reject items.
8. A sturdy display easel must be provided for framed pieces.
9. Any quilts over 100 inches wide may have to be draped.

Submission of Items: Thursday, April 17, 2008 between 10 am and 6:30 pm (quilts to be judged 10 am to Noon) at the North Kingstown High School (at the Rear Entrance); 150 Fairway Drive off Route 1A just south of Wickford.

1. Each item must have a label that states the following: **Quilter's name, phone # and the title of the work**. If possible bring each item in a clear plastic bag.
2. If you are unable to submit your work in person, we will accept it from your designee and give that person the receipts you will need to retrieve your work.
3. It would be much appreciated by the Registration Committee if you did not wait until the 6:30 deadline but instead brought your quilts in earlier. Thanks.

Retrieval of Items: Sunday, April 20, 2008 after the take down, which begins at 4PM. Take a number and you will be called when take down is completed. If someone other than you is picking up your quilts, they will need a note to the committee from you along with your receipts. The committee will be available until 5:30 pm to return your work. If any work is not picked up by that time, it will be the responsibility of the owner of the work to contact Natalie at 943-5961 to arrange retrieval.

Optional Insurance Fee: Insurance may be purchased for \$1.00 per each \$200 increment based upon actual value of your quilt. \$1 to \$200 = \$1 Fee; \$201 to \$400 = \$2 Fee; \$ 401 to \$600 = \$3 Fee; etc List the **actual value** of the quilt if you elect to purchase the optional insurance.

Examples: Value is \$ 320 = \$2.00 fee; value \$ 550 = \$ 3.00 fee, \$ 900 = \$5.00 fee

Make check for payment to "NBQA" You may combine insurance and judging fee in one check. Indicate desired insurance coverage and amount of fee on 2nd page of the form.

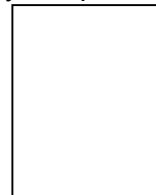
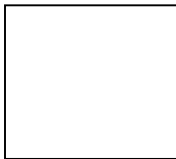

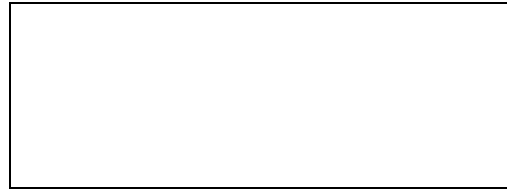
