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Why Should My Quilt Be Critiqued? by 2008 Quilt Show Judge, Holice Turnbow

When we attend a quilt show, we are always drawn to those few quilts hanging proudly with ribbons of blue, red, white, yellow. Sometime there is more than one ribbon on the quilt indicating it was singled out for special consideration for its workmanship in more than one feature. Often times the reasons are obvious yet, other times we stand there and say WHY!

I am a firm believer in an evaluation or critique system for quilts entered in the show. The statement I often hear "oh! We hang quilts just for the enjoyment of the public", doesn't move me to a great degree. Let me tell you why I am a believer.

Putting the ribbon/prize money aside, the evaluation or critique of a quilt should give the quilt maker an unbiased review of the entire guilt. The results should be a learning experience for the guilt maker. When we make a guilt, we see it through our eyes based on our own experience, skill and purpose of the guilt being made. We also see most of it up close and when finished give a sigh of relief that it is done. The evaluator sees it as an anonymous piece and can make his or her evaluation based on established criteria and experience in critiquing or evaluating many different types of auilts.

I also believe in a fair and impartial process which is constructive and instructive and not destructive but gives sufficient information for improvement in the quilt maker's skill. Now having said all this, I'll get down to the details of what the evaluator will look for and comment on them.

The following elements are evaluated within the context of the group or guild's purpose as well as any specific instructions on the entry form. Theme may be one of the added elements determined by the show committee.

Workmanship:

Is the workmanship crisp and clean? Are the seams straight and do other shapes retain their intended form? Do the squares, triangles and diamonds retain their intended shape or have they become eschewed in the piecing or appliqué process? Therefore, the accuracy of stitching the pieces together should be true. Are the points true or might they have been cut off or extended in the process? Are true seam allowances maintained throughout the piecing process with little or no shadowing?

Are the borders straight and cut and pieced to maintain the square of the guilt?

Are the bindings even and the fabric used, if directional, cut with the pattern and not looking like it is twisted? Are the corners well mitered or does one or more look like Dr. Spock of Star Trek lost an ear? Some judges will want the mitered fold stitched closed.

Quilting:

Is the quilting design compatible with the patchwork or appliqué design of the quilt?

Does the guilting fill the spaces providing uniformity to the guilt?

Does the thread color add to the overall design or does the use of contrasting color add a secondary design which may be distracting?

Are the stitches even and consistent whether by hand or machine?

Overall Appearance:

This element can be subjective with the evaluator because we each have our own opinions especially when it comes to color used. Therefore, does the color enhance the patchwork or appliqué or emphasize certain elements which stand out more than others?

Overall appearance can also be the general condition of the guilt. Pet hairs and hanging threads detract from the beauty and workmanship of the guilt.

I could go on and on, but the bottom line is that a third party who looks at the guilt can be beneficial in helping the quilt maker to see the quilt through impartial eyes. You and a friend or relative are the first two. The results will give both reinforcement to the quilt maker's workmanship as well as offer constructive and beneficial suggestions where improvement can be made.

Good luck. Finish up those masterpieces, which all are, and bring them for the world to see.

Classroom – Mug Mats (printable directions also on NBQA website)

Yet another pattern for Mug Mats. Please make some for our Quilt Show. There are 3 patterns to choose from on our website.

MUG RUGS

Pattern submitted by Barbara Barber

Material: 5" base square 5" square of batting

4-5" squares of fabric; use 2 squares each of coordinating fabrics.

Fold the 4-5" squares in half, wrong sides together and press.

With the batting on the bottom, place the base fabric right side up on top.

Next, lay down your folded squares in an over, under, over, under pattern.


Stitch with a 1/4" seam all the way around.

Trim the corners.

Turn & press.

The batting is inside. The mug mat is complete.

This can also be done using triangles and circles.



This is the layered piece before sewing:

1st layer – batting

2nd layer – base square right side up

3rd layer – the 4 folded squares in "under, over" pattern

Information Concerning NBQA Members' Quilt Show 2008 Submission of Entries to the Quilt Show

Date and Times for Submission of Quilts: *Thursday*, April 17

Quilts to be **Judged** must be brought in **between 10 am and noon**, all others 10 to 6:30pm

Date of Judging: Thursday, April 17 starting at Noon

Date of Set Up: *Thursday*, April 17 9am to 5 pm and *Friday*, April 18 from 9 am until finished **Dates of the Quilt Show**: *Saturday*, April 19 - 10 am to 5 pm; *Sunday*, April 20 -10am to 4pm

Submission of Entry Forms: Publication of November 2007 Newsletter to February 21, 2008 that is a Quilt Guild Meeting date. An entry form will be in the Newsletter and on the NBQA website (nbquilts.org). For multiple entries, please copy the form so you have one for each of your entries.

- 1. Complete and submit an entry form for each item by February 21, 2008.
- 2. Attach a color photo to each entry form. (Work need not be completed in photo.)
- 3. Submit entries to Registration Chairperson, Natalie Bielawski at meetings or by mail: 184 East View Ave, Cranston, RI 02920. Please observe the 2/21/08 deadline as much work is involved in preparing the program. Registration questions: 943-5961.
- 4. Work previously shown at an NBQA show may not be resubmitted unless by invitation. All quilts submitted must be made by NBQA members.
- 5. If a quilt is from a published pattern or is the result of a class, please acknowledge.
- 6. Six inch sleeves are required on all quilts except miniatures and small wall hangings.
- 7. NBQA Quilt Selection Committee reserves the right to accept or reject items.
- 8. A sturdy display easel must be provided for framed pieces.
- 9. Any quilts over 100 inches wide may have to be draped.

Submission of Items: Thursday, April 17, 2008 between 10 am and 6:30 pm (quilts to be judged 10 am to Noon) at the North Kingstown High School (at the Rear Entrance); 150 Fairway Drive off Route 1A just south of Wickford.

- 1. Each item must have a label that states the following: **Quilter's name**, **phone # and the title of the work**. If possible bring each item in a clear plastic bag.
- 2. If you are unable to submit your work in person, we will accept it from your designee and give that person the receipts you will need to retrieve your work.
- 3. It would be much appreciated by the Registration Committee if you did not wait until the 6:30 deadline but instead brought your quilts in earlier. Thanks.

Retrieval of Items: Sunday, April 20, 2008 after the take down, which begins at 4PM. Take a number and you will be called when take down is competed. If someone other than you is picking up your quilts, they will need a note to the committee from you along with your receipts. The committee will be available until 5:30 pm to return your work. If any work is not picked up by that time, it will be the responsibility of the owner of the work to contact Natalie at 943-5961 to arrange retrieval.

Optional Insurance Fee: Insurance may be purchased for \$1.00 per each \$200 increment based upon actual value of your quilt. \$1 to \$200 = \$1 Fee; \$201 to \$400 = \$2 Fee; \$ 401 to \$600 = \$3 Fee; etc. List the **actual value** of the quilt if you elect to purchase the optional insurance.

Examples: Value is \$ 320 = \$2.00 fee; value \$ 550 = \$ 3.00 fee, \$ 900 = \$5.00 fee

Make check for payment to "NBQA" You may combine insurance and judging fee in one check. Indicate desired insurance coverage and amount of fee on 2nd page of the form.




