

President's Message

Another year of NBQA is almost at an end. We will be voting for new committee chairs and officers at the May meeting, enjoying a delicious strawberry shortcake, and bidding on items in support of the NE Quilt Museum. I hope everyone can attend. I would especially like to thank all the current chairs and their committees for all the work they did to put on some great programs this year. Plans are in the works for next year's quilt show. It's going to be called "Touching Stars", so dust off all those star quilt UFOs in the bottom of your closet and get them finished for the show. Of course, we'll be happy to have your quilt with nary a star on it. We hope to have confirmation of the date and place soon. Unfortunately we were unable to book the Hoffman Challenge Fashion Show, but we are looking into having a special trunk show or lecture on the Saturday of the show. We also decided to switch from the Vermont system of judging to the elimination method. Under the Vermont system, you got points for the quality of your workmanship in a number of areas, and if you scored enough points, you got a certain color of ribbon. It was felt that the points themselves lacked meaning, and it was cumbersome for the judge to calculate them. In the elimination method, first, second, and third place, and honorable mention ribbons will be awarded in a number of categories, so your quilt will be judged against the others submitted. There will also be special recognition ribbons for quilts that have some outstanding quality, viewer's choice and best of show. You will get comments from the judge, whether you win a ribbon or not. Having your quilt judged gives you an opportunity for a professional critique, but it is not required for entering a quilt in our show.

Don't forget to renew your membership! The forms have to be received by May 31st. We have some great programs planned for next year that you're not going to want to miss. Karen Combs is coming from Tennessee, and Susan Brubaker Knapp from North Carolina. We'll also be hosting Ann Lainhart and Leah Allman from Massachusetts, and a bus trip to New York City is being planned for the fall. Have a great summer, and see you in September!


Shop Hop prizes will be awarded at the May meeting.


