


Comfort Quilts

Strip Challenge

This is a great way to reduce your stash of left over 2 1/2" WOF (width of fabric) pieces and you could go home with a Jelly Roll! You would need to bring in 3 or more strips per meeting. You will receive a ticket for every 3 strips you bring in. Near the end of the business meeting there will be a drawing. <u>You must be present at that time to win</u>. We will continue to draw until we get a winner.

This is how it works: Check the month and bring 3 or more strips representing the flower or the flower colors. Here are the FLOWERS and colors for each Month:

January	CARNATION	White, pink, reds and purples.
February	VIOLET	Blue, mauve, yellow, cream and violet.
March	DAFFODIL	White, yellow and orange.
April	SWEET PEA	Soft colors, pink, yellow, purple & blue.
May	LILY OF THE VALLEY	White in color with a hint of green.

Block of the Month

January – Disappearing 4 Patch Quilts Block Criss Cross

Four 5 inch squares are used in this tutorial to make a block that is 8 inches square.

February – "Wonky" Disappearing 4 Patch

Just for fun – cut your four patch into 9 pieces and then sew them back together to make a "Wonky" Disappearing 4 Patch.

Use 4 larger squares, 6 or 7 inches square, to make these fun blocks. Don't worry about the unfinished size, we can trim them down to one size or add borders to each block to bring them up to a certain size.

By car:

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstates 93 and 495 and Route 3 From Route 3 take exit 30B northbound or exit 30A southbound onto I-495 towards Lawrence. From I-495 take exit 35C onto the Lowell Connector. Continue about 2 miles to Exit 5B onto Thorndike St

At the 4th light, Thorndike Street merges into Dutton Street. Go to the 2nd light and turn right onto Market Street.
