New England Quilt Museum





2017 – 2018 NBQA Block of the Month Program

Our last block of the month for this guild year is the **Disappearing Nine Patch Criss-Cross**. Using 5 inch squares or assorted **30's fabrics** create a Nine Patch. Next cut the Nine Patch in half vertically and horizontally (like a plus sign) and then WITHOUT MOVING the pieces, cut the four sections in half diagonally (see photo on left). Now turn and rearrange your pieces as shown in the photo on the right to create your Disappearing Nine Patch Criss-Cross block. Thank you for participating in this year's block of the month program and for donating your practice blocks to the Comfort Quilts Program!

By car:

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstates 93 and 495 and Route 3 From Route 3 take exit 30B northbound or exit 30A southbound onto I-495 towards Lawrence. From I-495 take exit 35C onto the Lowell Connector. Continue about 2 miles to Exit 5B onto Thorndike St

At the 4th light, Thorndike Street merges into Dutton Street. Go to the 2nd light and turn right onto Market Street.

The museum's changing exhibitions, Brown Bag Lectures, gallery talks, and special events are updated weekly at nequiltmuseum.org.
