## **Spotlight on Vendors**

## **Folk Art Quilts**

Folk Art Quilts, at 344 Main Street in Wakefield, RI, is owned and operated by two sisters, Evie Cherms and Mary Loftes. Evie has been quilting for years and convinced her sister Mary that opening a quilt store was the thing to do. They have been in operation for over nine years. Three years ago in May, on Mother's Day, they made the move to their present place in the old Kenyon's Department Store because they needed more space for their growing business that was in another location on Main Street. Before they opened their quilt store they both taught Tole decorative painting in Narragansett for 5 years. Now both Evie and Mary are quilters and two of the best resources for answering questions about fabric choices, quilting, or sewing.

Folk Art Quilts is so filled with fantastic fabrics that it takes more than one trip up and down the aisles to discover all the "must have" fabrics to add to your stash. There are reproduction vintage fabrics, batiks, juvenile prints, calicos, oriental prints and my favorites, black and white prints, plus many more beautiful fabrics. In addition to fabric, there are books, quilting patterns and supplies, wool penny rug patterns and supplies, and finished quilts by quilt artist Beth Gutierrez.

Several clubs meet at Folk Art Quilts on a regular basis:

- The Thimbleberries Club, led by Joan Halley, meets once a month on Wednesday evenings at 7 pm and Thursday mornings at 10 am.
- The Girl Gang meets the third Friday of the month at 2 pm. They base their time spent quilting on the "Girl Gang" quilt project designed by Jan Patek, a nationally known fabric designer and quilt artist. The 2005-2006 Quilt Project was "It's A Wonderful Life," designed by Jan.
- The Design Group (full at the moment) meets in the afternoon on the second Saturday of the month. Every month they have a different challenge to express as a quilt and then bring the finished piece to the next meeting for "Show and Tell."
- The monthly Quilted Sweatshirt Class has it's next meeting in the morning on November 11th.

Folk Art Quilts co-sponsors the Annual Quilt Show and Fundraiser at the South County Museum in Narragansett. This event takes place in July, and this past year, over 85 quilts were entered for judging. Every year, Folk Art Quilts donates a quilt for the Raffle at this Quilt Show.

Beth Gutierrez stopped by while I was at Folk Art Quilts and I got to hold "Willow," one of the two Chihuahuas that Beth recently rescued and that are now up for adoption. What a treat to be licked and nuzzled while talking to Beth, Evie, and Mary. Beth has a workshop coming up on January 8th for NBQA where she will show how to make "Black Line Appliqué Seagulls." Beth also gives workshops and classes at Folk Art Quilts.

Two or sometimes three times a year, Folk Art Quilts has a "30 % off everything" sale. Get on their mailing list to find out about classes and sale dates by contacting Evie or Mary at folkartquilts@cox.net or at 789-5985.

## **Quilting Tips and Tricks**

Quilters have many ways of making the process of quilting easier and more convenient. Here are a few from Marcus Brothers Tips (<a href="www.marcusbrothers.com/features/tip">www.marcusbrothers.com/features/tip</a> archive.html)

- Store patchwork squares in new pizza boxes.
- Run a hot iron over a used dryer sheet to remove any sticky stuff from the iron.
- Use a curling iron to press open seams right at the sewing machine.
- Place batting in a dryer and run the dryer for 10 minutes to remove all creases.

There are hundreds of other tips at this site and the opportunity to share your special tip or trick.

#### From our President, Pat Cole:

Invest in a top quality surge protector to protect your equipment during a power surge.

### From Pat Ferguson:

A flannel lined, vinyl tablecloth make a great design wall and can double as a tablecloth for the upcoming Pot Luck Supper!

### From **Ginny Perry**:

Instead of marking straight lines e.g. to quilt a grid pattern, use masking tape to create the grid, sew to the inside of the tape, then remove!


### From **Deb Hobgood**:

Instead of using a thimble, I put several layers of crazy glue (let each layer dry before adding the next) on my finger. This creates effective protection while maintaining flexibility.

Another site that is well worth a look for quilting tips is Quiltmaker (<u>www.quiltmaker.com/tips</u>).

Diane Gaudynski submitted a tip there for layering your quilt. Tape a button to the center of the work table so the centers of all three layers are easily positioned by feel.

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstate 93 and 495 and Route 3. Take the Lowell Connector from either Interstate 495 (Exit 35C) or Route 3 (Exit 30N Northbound or 30A Southbound) to Thorndike Street (exit 5B). Go the 6th light and turn right onto Market Street.

Park at street meters, the Leo A. Roy Market Street Garage, or on weekends ONLY, the lot behind the museum on Middle Street.
