NBQA Membership Meeting - May 19, 2016

The evening started with a Strawberry Social provided by the Hospitality Committee.

President – Hope Barton called the meeting to order at 7:20 PM.

Basket Raffle Donation – Gerry Bergreen announced that \$2000 will be given to charity from the quilt show basket raffle.

Gerry introduced Ann Marie from the VA Hospital Women's program and Janice from the Hope Alzheimer's Center. Each gave a summary of their respective programs and expressed much gratitude for our donations.

Secretary – Melanie Johnston. The General Meeting minutes from March were voted on and approved without change.

Treasurer – Lisa Champlin: April income: \$857. YTD Income: \$12,043. April Expenses, \$166.19. YTD Expenses, \$7,853.93.

Membership – Judy Chase. Membership renewal checks are being collected and will be deposited in June.

Judy will be doing the membership booklet for the 2016-2017 guild year but is looking for someone to train and work with her who would then take over for the 2017-2018 guild year. Please contact her if you are willing and able to do this.

Mug Mats – Allison Wilbur thanked everyone who made mug mats for the Quilt Show and awarded prizes to the three most prolific makers. 3rd place – Carolyn Marshall; 2nd place – Brenda Dziedzic; 1st place – Judy Beardsley. Judy has agreed to take over heading up the mug mat effort for the 2018 show.

Quilt Show Report - Joan Potter thanked all who helped with our quilt show and conducted the volunteer raffle. Thirty prizes were given. Joan announced there were 980 attendees and we had a net financial surplus of \$1,390.

Workshops – Hope Barton announced that the Sewing Room is closing at the end of May. The May applique workshop will be held at Sharon Mayers' Piecing with Poppers Studio. Hope will be taking over Programs for the coming guild year and is looking for a new workshop location. If you have a suggestion, please get preliminary information from the facility including Friday or Saturday availability, cost, size of space, parking, access to water and a kitchenette for Hope.

Raffle Quilt – Hope Barton extended thanks to all those who stepped up to make the raffle quilt a reality in a shortened time frame: Pat Harrison and members of her EQ group for design, Tina Craig for helping with fabric selection, making the center medallion and overall construction assistance, Maria Lage for construction assistance and applique work, Sharon Mayers for a discount on fabric and a space for construction, Susan Ellis for quilting, and Cathey LaBonte for ticket sales!

Raffle Quilt - Cathey LaBonte drew the name of the raffle quilt winner - Jane Dennison from Mystic!

Cathey then thanked Hope for her service as President for the last two years and gave her a gift from the guild.

President - Hope Barton gave each officer and committee chair a gift along with a personal thank you.

Fabric Challenge – Susan Chace is looking for a replacement. Billie Bunnewith volunteered to take over.

Program – Peggy Murphy reminded us that in a joint venture with NBQA and Ningret Quilters, Bonnie Hunter will be teaching workshops on September 14 and 15 at the Masonic Temple in N. Kingstown. Peggy also reviewed the workshops for the next guild year. They will be posted on the website soon.

Newsletter - Sara Crocker announced that Sally Cooper will be working with her and Maybeth Cost on the newsletter for next year.

2016 - 2017 NBQA Block of the Month Program

This year the Block of the Month program will again work with the Comfort Quilts program. Members can make blocks to donate to the Comfort Quilts program, and the blocks will be used to make quilts during the Quilt-a-thon. Of course, you can always make a block for yourself.

When you bring your blocks to the meeting you will receive a fat quarter that you can use to make the next block of the month. This fabric has been donated to our group by various fabric companies and individuals.

This year ONE BLOCK PATTERN has been chosen for the BOM Program: the "Hashtag" Quilt from the Missouri Star Quilt Company. The directions are below and will be posted on the website with a link where the directions can be found. You can view the tutorial on their You Tube channel for block construction direction.

We, however, will be using 2.5" strips so the finished size will be 10" (unfinished size = 10.5")

Each month, members can make the block in the suggested color way. Backgrounds should be a neutral color to complement the main color.

September - Any Color

October - Oranges and Rusts and Golds

November - Browns, from Tan and "Paper Bag" to Chocolate

January - [none - demo night]

February - Reds and Pinks

March - Greens

April - Yellows and Golds

May - Blues

We hope you will choose to become involved in this year's Block of the Month program. It promises to be rewarding as we contribute to NBQA's charitable efforts and sharpen our piecing skills.

Hashtag Quilt Block Directions (Pound Sign for us Oldsters!)

From Background Fabric: Cut Three (3) 2.5 inch strips by at least 8 inches

From Color or Print Fabric: Cut Two (2) 2.5 inch strips by 10.5 inches

AND Cut Two (2) 2.5 inch strips by 8 inches

Sew 2.5 inch strips by 8 inch strips of background and color/print together as follows:

Sew Background to Color/Print to Background to Color/Print to Background

This strip set should measure 10.5 inches wide by the length of your strips (8 inches)

Press this strip set and then, cut Three (3) 2.5 inch segments from the strip set.

Place the two (2) 2.5 x 10.5 inch Color/Print strips between the pieced strip sets as shown in the picture above.

Sew strip sets and color/print strips together to make one "Hashtag Block" measuring 10.5 inches square (unfinished).



However, please remember that we are using 2.5 inch wide strips for our blocks, and NOT 1.5 inch wide strips that Jenny uses in the video.



The summer challenge rules are:

The NBQA summer challenge is to make something from black and white fabrics with the addition of only one other fabric (i.e. not black and white). You can use as many different black and white fabrics as you like, and they can have minimal amounts of gray or silver but no other colors in them. The one additional fabric can be any color or combination of colors, and you can use as much of it as you wish. Solid black and solid white are allowed but should not be the only black and white fabrics used.
