And speaking of new things, next year we are moving the workshops to Fridays (and some Saturdays) at the Sewing Room in Exeter. We hope this will make things easier for everyone. Having the workshop and meeting on the same day makes for a very long one, and often we choose to skip either the workshop or the meeting because we have to be home for dinner with the family. It's a long day for our teachers, too. As a bonus, holding the workshop at a quilt shop will mean you can buy something you didn't bring.

The other new initiative is a modernization of our website. We are retaining a consultant to provide the new framework, and we are looking for some members to provide input and suggestions. The website has been a great resource, and this is an opportunity to make it even better. I hope you will contact me or Melanie Johnston to get involved as soon as possible.

Plans are in the works for the 2014 Quilt Show. The Fabric Challenge has been announced. Look elsewhere in this newsletter for more info. I hope everyone enters at least one quilt in the show, even if they don't participate in the challenge.



Comfort Quilts: Donna Woodworth has some partially completed kits that need to be finished. If necessary NBQA can reimburse for fabric purchased. The quilts will be donated at the September meeting.

Quilt Show: Joan Halley displayed the fabric for the 2014 Fabric Challenge. The rules are similar to last year's. The fabric will be sold as half yards for \$5. The quilts must be completed by the Feb. 2014 meeting. Please see Sue Chace for more info. Ginny Perry reminded everyone to keep making mug mats.

2014 QUILT SHOW FABRIC CHALLENGS

The challenge fabric selected for 2014 is Black Contempo Floral #22536 (see photo below) which is part of the fabric line Sunburst by Studio 8 for Quilting Treasures. The complete fabric line can be viewed at QuiltingTreasures.com

- The fabric will be sold in ½ yard pieces at the general meetings for \$5.00 each. All NBQA Members and Associate Members are eligible to participate.
- The challenge fabric must be recognizable on the front side of the finished item, but there is no minimum block size. The challenge fabric must be used within the design, not just as a border.
- All items submitted must be constructed to include three layers (top, batting, back) and be held together with stitching. A qualifying quilted item may include, in addition to quilts, clothing, purses, totes or other accessories, etc
- The size of the item must be not less than 10" x 10" (or a total of 40") and not larger than 36" x 42" (or a total of 160").
- Completed entries must be brought to the February 2014 general meeting along with a 2014 Quilt show entry form. The entries will be displayed during that meeting and the members will vote for a variety of ribbons which will be awarded at the Quilt Show.
- An entry that is made with 80% or more of Quilting Treasures fabrics will be eligible for consideration for a Quilting Treasures Award to be presented at the 2014 Quilt Show. Qualifying entries can use any of the Quilting Treasures fabric lines within their challenge entry; fabric is not limited to the Sunburst fabric line. Check the Quilting Treasures.com site for a list of shops that carry Quilting Treasures fabrics.



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
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NBQA Raffle Quilt - Blazing Star Call for Quilting Proposals
