I took a workshop in Nashua this past fall where the teacher drummed into us that what you create in a workshop is a record of the technique only and once you have learned the technique you should let it go. She believed that to encumber ourselves with every workshop project is guilt producing and has a negative effect. Since I have so many UFO's and they are doing nothing but making me feel guilty about starting new, exciting projects, I'm adopting her philosophy. I'm going to go through my UFO's, tag the newer ones with a 3 year expiration date and lose those with techniques I've mastered or found a way around. Who needs guilt from quilting?

Speaking of guilt – how did that "expired in 2000" box of my younger daughter's favorite macaroni & cheese manage to still be in the cupboard when I went looking for a new jar of my favorite peanut butter just now. I must have been saving it for her! Hmmm...I could add it to the box of other stuff she keeps promising to take with her to her apartment.....

Lose the quilt guilt,







Classroom - Mug Mats


PINWHEEL SQUARE MUG MATS

Cut 2 coordinating pieces of fabric 3 ½ by 6 ½ Place the 2 pieces of fabric right sides together and pin to the paper grid.

GRID



Make sure the grid covers both pieces of fabric. With the paper side up and a small stitch length (1.5 setting) sew on the dash lines. Cut on the solid lines. Remove the paper. Press to the dark side fabric and trim points. You now have 4 half square triangles that measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches square. Assemble the according to the diagram below to make a pinwheel.







Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstate 93 and 495 and Route 3. Take the Lowell Connector from either Interstate 495 (Exit 35C) or Route 3 (Exit 30N Northbound or 30A Southbound) to Thorndike Street (exit 5B). Go the 6th light and turn right onto Market Street.
