President: Melanie Johnston called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

Treasurer: Beginning balance \$13,413.19 in the General Fund, GF Income \$535.00; GF Expenses

\$618.89; General Fund ending balance \$13,329.30, Quilt Show balance \$8,000.

Comfort Quilts: Quilts were presented to Mary Cline on behalf of Wood River Health Clinic. One quilt is ready for Ronald McDonald House and two tops were given out to be quilted. Joan Taylor thanked everyone for their support of the Comfort Quilts program. Donna Woodworth announced that help would be needed to retrieve stored material from Ruth Batchelor's cellar.

Vice President: Billie Bunnewith announced the Summer Challenge theme of Seed Packets, with a maximum size of 24" per side. The 2012 Raffle Quilt will be quilted by Sharon Mayers.

Hospitality: Dotty Calvano thanked everyone who had provided refreshments during the year or helped out in the kitchen. Mary Padbury will be succeeding her next year.

Publicity: Joan Johnson announced the Quilters Connection Show on June 3-5 in Watertown, MA. **Membership:** Renewal forms were being accepted tonight, and **must** be returned by the end of May. If not returned in time, your spot will be given to someone on the waiting list.

NEQM: Ginny Perry thanked everyone for their auction donations and Sue Stedman for her help.

Newsletter: Diana Funke thanked everyone for their feedback.

Quilt Show: Joan Taylor announced the dates, April 21-22, 2012, with setup beginning on Thursday the 19th. The show title will be Garden of Quilts. Admission will be \$8. Advanced tickets will be sold: \$5 for members, \$7 general admission. The Hoffman Challenge will be exhibited in the Fashion Show, and there will be a special exhibit of Fat Quarter Challenge quilts. Joan is looking for someone to coordinate quilt displays in North Kingstown shops and/or local libraries, to advertise the show. As usual, there will be a raffle drawing for volunteers.

Program: Barbara Chace asked attendees from the Hawaiian appliqué class to bring their projects in September for Show and Tell. Signups are being accepted for the September workshop with Joan Shay, Dimensional Monarch Butterfly, and for October, a 2-day workshop with Carole Ann Grotrian on Indigo Dying, to be held outdoors at Pat Harrison's home in Exeter (weather permitting). Other workshops for 2011-12 are November – Esterita Austin, waterside landscape; January – Pat Harrison on Electric Quilt; February -- Denise Greenlund and Kassie Randall; March – Judith Lazalere, art strip quilting; May – Carole Taylor, 2 day color workshop.

President: The proposed change to the bylaws regarding composition of the Executive Board was voted on and passed unanimously. The slate of officers was announced. No volunteer yet for Program Chair. Due to the difficulty in finding someone to fill the position, the position was changed such that the chair only has to book programs/speakers and take signups for workshops. She could recruit volunteer hostesses for each workshop to handle support services for the guest speakers. In addition, the Program Chair would be entitled to one free workshop of her choosing. No nominations were made by the floor, so Secretary Joan Potter cast one ballot for the following:

Designs can be based on traditional seed packets like pansies or carrots, or choose something non-traditional like family photo "seeds" that when planted grow into a family tree. Use your imagination and let your creativity "grow" during the warm weather months when inspiration is all around. Challenge quilts should be no larger than 24inches x 24 inches - there is no minimum size. Entries must be brought to the September meeting where members will vote for their favorite. Prizes will be awarded that evening based on the members' votes.






