Narragansett Bay Quilters' Association Minutes of the General Meeting – May 15, 2008

President- Pat Harrison: called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

-126 members plus 2 associates in attendance.

Comfort Quilts - were presented to Martha Sholes of Project Linus by Joan Taylor who thanked everyone who donated time, materials and support to the making of these quilts. Martha thanked NBQA for the quilts and gave us an in-depth description of Project Linus and the many places that receive the quilts. All quilts must be handmade from crib to twin size with each quilt being labeled. She asked if our group had a preference where the quilts go- the reply was where the need is greatest.

28 Quilts were given to Martha (plus 10 were taken after the quilt show). 8 more quilts went to the Hematology Oncology Associates of RI and 11 went to Wood River Health Clinic in Hope Valley. Joan asked that NBQA members please consider donating blocks, tops & fabrics to begin making more quilts in our August Workshop. Joan will also welcome names for potential recipients of the next batch of quilts.

Show & Tell - President- Pat Harrison: announced that June 5th will be the transitional board meeting. She also showed a copy of Quilt Art 2009 Engagement Calendar featuring a quilt by our own Denise Greenlund.

Vice President - Pat Bruno asked everyone to turn in their quilt raffle tickets for the big drawing tonight. The summer challenge for September will be "Think Outside the Block" -details will be in the next newsletter and everyone is encouraged to participate.

Secretary - Pat Ferguson: Everyone should have read the March & April meeting minutes printed in the last newsletter. Motioned and second to accept Secretary's report.

Treasurer- Joan Taylor: QUILT Show Fund---\$10.234.18 Expenses ---\$6,716.29 Income---\$8,919.00 End Bal---\$12,436.89 General Fund-----\$7,170.07 Expenses---%289.58 Income---\$1,555.00 End Bal---\$8,435.49

Motioned and second to accept Treasurer's report. Joan also gave a recap of the show expenses and a general budget recap.

Quilt Show Report- Joan Taylor: please refer to the complete report in the newsletter. There will be a final report in September after all expenses are in. Passport winner was Barbara Kutger of North Kingstown. Raffle basket winners are in newsletter. Joan T. recognized everyone who worked on set up and the show, donated time, materials for baskets, made items for auction, etc. A special thanks to Barbara Chace & Janice Cullinane for working on the basket raffle. Quilt photos and Viewer's choice comments are available for pick up. There are more 2008 pins available for \$6 each. Please sign up now for the workers raffle drawing later tonight.

Show Judging- Joan Halley: gave the lowdown on judging of the quilts. Hollis Turnbow was particular about bindings, borders and sashings being lined up and straight. He did not give many comments with blue and purple ribbons believing that the points speak for themselves. Degree of complexity of design is not listed on our judging form, so this was not included in his judging. As a group we need to work on borders lying flat and bindings full of fabric. There was some discussion about hand vs. machine quilting being handled differently.

Historian- Barbara Hartford: has purchased new digital photo frame which has the quilt show photos on display at the sign- in table. Barbara expressed how proud she was of everyone in the quilt show, as she took all of the photo and saw so much talent.

Hospitality- Sue Ellis: thanked all who have brought food this year. Please sign up tonight for September.

Librarian- Naomi Champagne: all books taken out tonight can be enjoyed until September.

Membership-Norrene McGeary: received many members renewal checks but needs the paperwork also by the end of the month. 43 are on the waiting list. Checks received after June 1 will be processed laterwe can only deposit 100 checks per month so they will be deposited in June, July or August.

New England Quilt Museum - Ginny Perry: The results of the museum survey concluded that the 4th Sunday of every month will be free admission. The current exhibit is worth seeing. Mary Walter was very impressed with our show and how well members worked together. Lowell Quilt Festival Images will be Aug. 10. See Ginny for summer passes.

Workshop Guidelines

- 1. Workshops are held at the Westminster Unitarian Church in East Greenwich.
- 2. Cost of workshops varies and is priced to cover the cost of running that workshop including instructor fees. Workshops are limited to 20 participants.
- 3. To attend a workshop, you must register and pay in full in advance. Do this by seeking out one of the Program Chairpersons at a General Meeting (Sandy Barron or Pat Harrison) or by mailing in your check and request to: Sandy Barron P.O. Box 614 East Greenwich, RI 02818
- 4. Class starts at 10:00 AM. Plan to arrive at the workshop for 9:30 to provide set-up time. Workshops generally end about 3:30. Your help setting up and breaking down tables and chairs is appreciated.
- 5. Coffee and tea will be provided. You are welcome to bring a snack for yourself and/or a snack to share with other workshop participants.
- 6. You should bring a power strip and a light.
- 7. There will be a lunch break around noon. You may bring a bag lunch including a beverage or go out to get your lunch at local fast foods. A refrigerator is available to store lunches.
- 8. A group including the workshop leader will be going out to dinner at 5:00 to a local restaurant. Let the program leaders know if you plan to join the group so that a dinner reservation can be made for you.
- 9. Please make every effort to gather all the supplies on the supply list.
- 10. Please remember to turn your cell phone ring off at the workshop so that you do not disturb other participants.
- 11. Please wear a name tag. Stick-ons will be available at the workshop.
- 12. Per guild policy, if you are unable to attend the workshop, the workshop fee will be refunded only if your spot is filled two weeks previous to the workshop.
- 13. Classes and class space are available only to registered, paid participants. No "auditing" of classes is permitted. No concurrent use of the workspace for other projects is permitted.


