ZOOM MEETINGS

Beginning in September, NBQA will be using the Zoom format for our meetings. We hope you will try to tune in to our scheduled events this year. The Board is proposing that there would be Zoom monthly meetings from September to November with speakers. Conditions will be reassessed for January 2021 concerning Covid-19, on whether to continue with a Zoom format, or hold physical meetings. Thank you to all who attended the Zoom format meeting on Thursday August 20th. It went very well as a test.

Since we will be using Zoom this year for many of our meetings and speakers, you will want to be able to participate. If you are new to using Zoom, it would be helpful for you to view a YouTube video by Marcia Chadly, which gives a good introduction to Zoom. Go to YouTube.com and, in the search bar, type *Marcia Chadly Zoom tutorials*. The suggestion for her "Joining a zoom call for the first time" tutorial should pop up in this process. She also has other tutorials which seem to be good. Watch the tutorial and download Zoom prior to our meeting. That way you will be able to just click the link in the meeting invitation that you will receive from NBQA on the meeting night. The invitation will come from our Gmail account so it is good to have NBQA set up as an acceptable address in your contacts folder.

One other caution and a request...

Please use your full name when setting up your account, or when asking to be admitted to a Zoom meeting. We check the names against our paid membership list before admitting you into our Zoom meetings. This extra step on your part will help us keep unwanted visitors from "crashing" our meetings. Remember, your membership fee has paid for the Zoom account and any speakers we have this year, so please don't share our invitation emails with non-members, or post the link on any public social media account you may have. This is a primary benefit of membership this year!

TECHNICAL REMINDER FOR THIS COMING GUILD YEAR....

Because of an increased reliance on our gmail account for communicating with members, we are asking all members to please put "Narraganset Bay Quilters Association" and our email address, MBQAmail@gmail.com into your contacts folder. Some email services will send NBQA emails to a spam folder, and you may not ever see it unless you go looking for our emails. We will be sending newsletters, Zoom meeting notices and other emails to you this year. We hope you will be able to see them and join us as we navigate this virtual world.



PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS

Weeks Ringle from the Modern Quilt Studio will be our presenter for our September 17th meeting! She will be discussing "Rethinking Color." Starting on September 11th you will be able to view her lecture on YouTube. Please see her directions below (copied from her webpage)....

Online Lectures

Our new two-part online lectures will be in a different format than you may have seen before. They are designed to give your guild members the flexibility to watch on their schedule while offering a personal connection with live Q&A sessions. When your guild books a lecture, we'll provide a link to a special YouTube page where your members can view the 45–60 minute lecture anytime within a one-week period prior to the live Q&A session. Members can watch it right before the live Q&A or they can enjoy the lecture any time during the week.

At the end of the seven day viewing period, Weeks or Bill will host a live Q&A session on Zoom, giving us the opportunity to discuss the lecture, answer your questions and give you a sneak peek of what we're working on. While access to the lecture and Q&A is limited to your guild only for the seven-day period, there is no limit to the number of members who can watch or join the Q&A session. Each lecture is tailored to online learning with carefully lighted, recorded and edited videos which allow your members to see details of our quilts that wouldn't be possible in a meeting hall. The lectures are accessed with just a click of a link and the live Q&A uses basic Zoom. Having seven days to watch the video also enables members to work out any technical issues they might have if they are new to virtual classes. The lecture link will expire at midnight after the live Q&A.

Technical Requirements

To watch the prerecorded lectures all you'll need is an internet connection and computer, phone or tablet capable of streaming YouTube videos. The live Q&A sessions will be held on Zoom. Members will need to be capable of running Zoom on a computer with webcam, or a phone or tablet. Zoom can be accessed via web browser or by installing the Zoom application on your device. If you're new to Zoom, we suggest you practice with a friend or try a test meeting on Zoom. System requirements for Zoom can be viewed here. We cannot provide I.T. support to guilds or individual students. It is each student's responsibility to make sure they are able and know how to stream YouTube videos and use Zoom prior to the lecture and Q&A.

After viewing the lecture, please prepare some questions for the Q&A session. We are all looking forward to this new adventure...

SHOW AND TELL



Don't forget to sign and date your block, in the bottom right hand corner past the 1/4" sewing line, with a fine line permanent black marker.

The deadline for the blocks has been extended to October 31, 2020.

NBQA has donated \$150 to the museum for 2020-2021. We hope to have basket raffles to send additional donations.


NBQA 2020-2021 MEMBRSHIP
