6:54pm: Presentation by David Sirota; Quilt While You're Ahead

Introduction by Gail Macera: DAVID SIROTA, also known as "Quilt Maven Dave", started quilting in the 1990's after a good friend taught him the basics of quilting. There was one technique that he was drawn to; paper piecing. He decided there had to be an easier way to do it; so, in 2004 he came up with the "Sirota No More Tears Paper Piecing" method. This method is easier to understand and takes at least half the time than the way paper piecing is done traditionally. His method has been so successful that David is now part of the Mancuso Show Management faculty teaching virtually all over the country. In addition, David is scheduled as a featured guest on "The Quilt Show" with Alex Anderson and Ricky Time! Without further ado, let me introduce the very sweet David Sirota...

David shared during his presentation that he will be having his own "Sip and Sew" class for those who have taken classes and have unfinished projects who wants help finishing projects; information will be forthcoming. He also has a new pattern coming out on Christmas Day; the link for the class for the new pattern will be on his website (www.quiltmavendave.com). His New Hampshire Beauty will also be featured on his website as a future class.
