

We will open these Saturday morning workshops for signups in August.



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QUILT SHOW NEWS

Planning for the 2022 show is underway. The tentative dates are April 23rd and 24th at North Kingstown High School. The name of the show will be *Spring Celebration*. Show applications will be due by the February 2022 meeting. There will be an opportunity to have your quilts judged in March at the Exeter Public Library. There is a fee for judging, and you will have to deliver the item to Pat Harrison in advance and retrieve it at the end of the judging day. Judged quilts are eligible to win ribbons, and all judged entries receive comments from the judge regarding areas of excellence and opportunities for improvement. Both judged and non-judged quilts are eligible to win a Viewer's Choice ribbon.



Applications and pictures that were submitted for the 2020 Quilt Show will be returned this year. An envelope for each contributor has been prepared and will be available at in-person gatherings such as *Comfort Quilts*. Any envelopes not picked up by the end of the year will be mailed.

Now is the time to be thinking about what you would like to enter in the show. We hope every member will enter at least one quilt. There is no limit to the number or size you may enter, but we reserve the right to eliminate some entries due to space considerations. All techniques for quilt construction are welcome, including traditional, contemporary, art quilts, hand and/or machine quilted, professionally quilted or quilted by you, use of a published pattern, original design, use of panel or "cheater cloth" prints, summer challenge or other contest entry, bed quilts, wall hangings, framed quilt pictures (you must provide an easel for framed pieces), juvenile or holiday theme, clothing, tote bags, table runners and other décor, etc. The only requirements for all entries are that the quilt is finished and you haven't previously shown it in an NBQA quilt show (other shows are OK).

RESULTS FOR QUILTER'S COLUMN QUESTION, MARCH/APRIL 2021

A big thank you to Pat Ferguson for sending some very valuable information in response to our bonus from the March/April 2021 Newsletter!!

I Press seams A) always open, B) always to one side, C) Whatever is best for the block/project.

The following is Pat's contribution:

Here is some information to consider regarding pressing seams open or to one side. Pressing seams to one side often makes it easier to piece as you can "nest" seams that meet. Whether to press seams open or to one side-it is important to look way ahead and consider how you are going to have your final 3 layer sandwich quilted together. If you are going to choose an edge-to-edge overall pattern or pantograph, it does not matter how you press your seams.

If you choose custom quilting for your final 3 layer sandwich, seam direction pressing does matter. As a longarm quilter, when custom quilting a quilt, I like to highlight elements in a block (like stars, or triangles or squares) by stitching-in-the-ditch (stitching on the low side of the seam pressed to one side). This makes the elements "pop" and makes the quilt look sharp and crisp. Many times I will ignore seam pressing directions in a pattern to have the seams go in the direction that enables me to stitch-in-the-ditch all the way around the main elements or to "pop" certain colors in a quilt.

If you press your seams open, you no longer have a ditch, so you loose the option to stitch-in-the-ditch in the final 3 layer sandwich quilting process. If you stitch the center of a pressed open seam, you will weaken the seam because you are stitching on top of the stitches, not on fabric, forcing the seam apart.

So, think ahead as to how you would like to have your quilt look in the final 3 layer sandwich quilting process.

Mark in town to consider outlier or the local and color

What is (are) your favorite quilting ruler(s) and why?

Elizabeth Bray....Long ruler.

Myra Paull...I most often use a 3" x 18" ruler, occasionally a 5" square and recently acquired a 12" square. I also often use a drafting triangle with a right angle.

Sally Cooper...Taj by Creative Grids. Great for quilting motifs. We stalee arc ruler that came with the ruler foot. I like it for straight lines and gentle curves,

Paula Weston...I really like O'lipfa rulers They are great for trimming/squaring because they have lines, not just ticks, to mark increments, and have black lines on one side and yellow lines on the other to accommodate both light and dark fabrics. They are hard to find though, even on line. I also like my Creative Grids Log Cabin Trim Tools. Perfect log cabins every time!

The four shops, (Quilted Crow, Cobblestone Quilts, Quilted Threads, and Red Barn Sewing and Yarn Center) will be observing their regular hours during the month of July. Don't forget to have your passport stamped and to pick up your free fat quarter when you visit the shops!

By car:

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstates 93 and 495 and Route 3. From Route 3 take exit 30B northbound or exit 30A southbound onto I-495 towards. Lawrence, From I-495 take exit 35C onto the Lowell Connector, Continue about 2 miles to Exit 5B onto Thorndike St.

At the 4th light, Thorndike Street merges into Dutton Street. Go to the 2nd light and turn right onto Market Street.
