

2022 SPRING CELEBRATION QUILT SHOW FABRIC CHALLENGE

NBQA members and associate members are eligible to participate.

After November 1st we will remove the one fat quarter of each restriction. Additional fat quarters may be purchased as long as we have fabric. Thanks!

Two challenge fabrics were chosen.

Both fabrics must be used and recognizable on the front of the quilt. They must be used within the design, not just as border, sashing, or binding.

All items submitted must have three layers (top, batting, back) held together by stitching. A qualifying item may be a quilt, clothing, purse, tote, or other accessory.

The size must be at least $10'' \times 10''$ (or a total of 40'' for all four sides) but not more than $24'' \times 36''$ (or a total of 120'' for all four sides).

Completed entries must be brought to the February 2022 meeting along with a completed 2022 show entry form. The membership will vote on the displayed quilts. Ribbons in various categories will be awarded at the quilt show. Quilts not at the meeting may be placed in the show but will not hang with the challenge quilts.

NEW ENGLAND QUILT MUSEUM

On View through December 31, 2021

Creativity in the Midst of Chaos

Artists from around the world were challenged to create a new quilt about the virus, life during quarantine, or simply how they preserved their sanity during these uncertain times.

Bedtime Stitches

The NEQM is pleased to host this exhibition of the original three-dimensional illustrations from Salley Mavor's latest book, *My Bed: Enchanting Ways to Fall Asleep around the World*. Made entirely by hand with fabric, beads, wire and found objects, each artwork is much like a shallow stage set assembled in shadow-box frames. To portray a distinct sense of place for each culture, Mavor researched the children, architecture, furnishings, and landscapes of different regions. It took her six weeks to two months to complete each intricate scene, one stitch at a time. Audiences of all ages will enjoy this imaginary trip around the world to discover the many ways children enjoy falling asleep. Works by Laura Petrovich-Cheney

Trained as a sculptor and fashion designer, Laura Petrovich-Cheney creates quilt-inspired sculptures to deal with life's ambiguities and uncertainties. Her creative practice embodies the enduring potential for renewal and beauty, even in the most devastating of times. Her material is salvaged wood gathered in the aftermath of environmental tragedies, such as Hurricane Sandy, forest fires in Gatlinburg, Tennessee, and from numerous other unnamed storms in Massachusetts. The wood is from damaged and wrecked houses – cedar sidings, screen doors, kitchen cabinets, wood tables- and repurposed into luminous, patchwork constructions. Through these difficult situations, the work is filled with vibrant color and uplifting hopefulness. Although Petrovich-Cheney uses materials and tools that are quite different from those used by traditional quilters, her finished works share similarities: objects of beauty and comfort that began as discarded scraps made meaningful by piecing them together into an object of comfort, beauty, hope and resilience.

Two color photos must be attached to each entry form, with the name of the quilt and the maker on the back of each photo.

If quilt is made from a published pattern or as the result of a class, please acknowledge. Please make a copy of each entry you submit so you have a record of what you entered.

A 4" - 6" sleeve is required on all quilts except miniatures and small wall hangings. A sturdy display easel must be provided by the entrant for framed pieces.

Each item must have a label that states the quilter's name and title of the work. If you are unable to submit your work in person, we will accept it from your designee and give that person the receipts you need to retrieve your work.

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstates 93 and 495 and Route 3. From Route 3 take exit 30B northbound or exit 30A southbound onto I-495 towards. Lawrence, From I-495 take exit 35C onto the Lowell Connector, Continue about 2 miles to Exit 5B onto Thorndike St.
