2025 NBQA Raffle Quilt Instructions

Timna Tarr's Mass Maples (used with permission)

For this quilt we need 287 classic maple leaf blocks, finished size is 4 1/2". The stem portion is paper pieced. The pattern was previously published in the Oct/Nov 2014 issue of *Quilter's Newsletter Magazine*.

Colors

Timna suggests using complementary colors for the leaf and background fabrics, including secondary and tertiary colors. Complementary colors are opposed to each other on the color wheel. Seconday colors are: orange, purple and green. Tertiary colors are the colors between the primary and secondary colors: red-orange, yellow-green, blue-violet, etc. You can Google "color wheel" if you don't have one to see which colors are complementary. **Please make 4 or more blocks** using different color combinations, and feel free to get creative. Any leftover blocks will be used to make mug mats for the next quilt show.


Block Construction

For each block, cut (1) 2" square of background fabric, and (3) 2" squares of leaf fabric. Cut (2) 2 3/8" squares of background fabric and (2) 2 3/8" squares of leaf fabric for the half square triangles. Layer (1) 2 3/8" square of background fabric over (1) 2 3/8" square of leaf fabric right sides together. Draw a diagonal line corner to corner, then stitch 1/4" away from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut in half along the line, and press open, with seam allowance towards the dark side. Repeat to make 4 half square triangles.

Draft a pattern for the stem. Draw a 2" square. Draw a line diagonally across the center, then draw a line 1/8" from each side. Erase or ignore the center diagonal line. The 1/4" section down the middle is the stem, and the triangles on each side are the background. Label the stem piece 1, and the triangles piece 2 and 3. To constuct the stem square using the David Sirota method, crease the paper toward you (pattern facing right side up) along the lines between 1 and 2 and 2 and 3. Cut a 3/4" x 3 1/4" rectangle of leaf fabric. On the back of the pattern, center the stem piece over the area for piece 1, right side up, wrong side towards the paper. Pin in place or use a small dot of a glue stick to hold it. Fold back the paper along the crease between piece 1 and piece 2. Align the background fabric right sides together with the raw edge of piece 1. Make sure you have at least 1/4" seam allowance, and that piece 2 is completely covered by the background fabric, then stitch along the crease, all the way to the edge of piece 1. Open up the paper and fold the background fabric open. Press the seam and trim the background fabric generously around piece 2. Secure piece 2 in place with a pin or dot of glue stick. Repeat steps for piece 3, again using the background fabric. Using a rotary cutter and ruler, trim the square along the paper edge to 2" square. Remove the paper. You can use the same paper to piece additional blocks.

Assemble the Maple Leaf block according to the diagram. Block should measure 5" square with the seam allowance. Turn completed blocks into Joan Potter at the October 2022 meeting, or mail to her at 264 Sutton Avenue, East Providence RI 02914.

NBQA SUMMER CHALLENGE 2022

"FABRIC CHALLENGE"

To Benefit the Needy

Rules:

- The Comfort Quilt committee will assemble bags of fabric for this challenge.
 Bags will have various colors and amounts given. No two bags will be alike, and we will keep a list of participants whereas there will be surprise prizes as well.
- From the fabric, members are asked to assemble a Comfort Quilt, (suitable for donating). Use of members own stash fabric will be necessary to finish the quilt for this challenge.
- 3. Sizes of this challenge must be a minimum of 25" x 30" (crib size) and no larger than 40" x 75" (twin size).
- 4. Bag pick up will be at the May 19, 2022 General Membership meeting at the church.
- 5. Finished quilts will be judged at the September 2022 meeting with 1st, 2nd and 3rd places given. Voting will be based on the membership present picking viewer's choice.
- 6. When the challenge is over, the quilts will be given to the Comfort Quilts Committee in collaboration with the Education Committee for a special exhibit at the Cranston Central Library in of December 2022. After the exhibit the Comfort Quilts will be distributed to the needy.

THE RETURN OF THE STRIP EXCHANGE AND BLOCK OF THE MONTH

For Strip Exchange, please bring:

 $(4) - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips of a **solid color or tone on tone** fabric. This qualifies for one prize ticket.

For *Block of the Month* please bring:

(3) - 10" blocks of children's fabrics. This qualifies for one prize ticket.

There will be 2 prizes for each category (4 prizes total) to be awarded. All fabrics will go to comfort quilts.

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





- L Lift spirits and entertain users while relieving caregivers.
- I Interest users in items on the mat. This stimulates senses and reinforces memory.
- **F** Focus user's attention during therapy or conversation with a caregiver. Helps visitors and staff find topics of conversation with users.
- **E** Exercise hands and fingers.

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstates 93 and 495 and Route 3. From Route 3 take exit 30B northbound or exit 30A southbound onto I-495 towards. Lawrence, From I-495 take exit 35C onto the Lowell Connector, Continue about 2 miles to Exit 5B onto Thorndike St.
