<u>Education Committee Peggy Lane, Barbara Stetson</u>: (as reported by Peggy) The committee was formed to promote the guild at libraries, quilt shows, public events, classes, farmer's markets, etc. They recently had a Ukrainian exhibit at the Cranston library. They do projects like yoyo's and red work with kids (all hand work so far) but may introduce machines at a future date. Besides the Cranston library, the East Greenwich and Warwick libraries are also interested. More volunteers are needed.

Comfort Quilts Brenda Starble, Linda Maslanka: (as reported by Brenda) On Saturday, May 7th there was a comfort quilt day at Louise's. Brenda and Linda showed 3 string quilt tops that were made. Another comfort quilt day will be held on Saturday, June 4th from 9 to 3 at Louise's. Members will be doing jelly roll race quilt tops that day. Bring your sewing machine. Brenda said that they have given more than 200 quilts to various organizations over the last 2 years and they have another 40 ready to be donated.

Quilt Show Joan Potter: (as reported by Joan)

Limit of 4 entries per member. Please rank your preference of entries from 1 to 4 in case we do not have room to display all the entries.

Judging (\$5 per entry) will take place in August due to the expiration date on the Ohio judge's plane ticket. Details of the drop off / pick up for judged quilts will be in the summer newsletter.

Quilt show applications will be available on the website and in the summer newsletter. Completed applications with 2 photos are due at the September meeting (no sleeves needed as most quilt will be draped over the pews) or can be mailed earlier to Diane Roberts, registration chair (her address will be listed on the application). Many volunteers are needed for registration, set up, admissions, white glove, raffle tickets, take down, etc. A sign-up sheet will be available at tonight's meeting and in September. We will be accepting raffle baskets (do not have to be quilt related) and mug mats at the September meeting. Tickets for the quilt show will be \$5.00.
