The January meeting of the Narragansett Bay Quilters Association was called to order at 6:30pm by Gail Macera.

President Gail Macera:

Gail welcomed members to the business meeting at 7:25pm.

Gail completed the application at JoAnn Fabrics for tax free purchases for the guild use only. See Gail or Blaire if you have any questions.

The monthly rent for the storage unit increased from \$135 to \$165.

At the January board meeting, the budgets were reviewed, and all committees are comfortable at this time.

Gail is looking for volunteers to create a committee of four for Programs for next year. She already has 2 people interested and is looking for 2 more. There will be more money available to plan next year's programs as we were very conservative with the budget for this year. Many hands will make light work for this committee. The Boutique will be held again at the March and May meetings. Fabric will be \$3.00 a yard. The Boutique has made more than \$3800 for the guild, so the fabric will drop from the previous \$5.00 a yard.

Treasurer Blaire Gagnon:

Blaire brought up an issue at the last board meeting regarding the fees charged by our bank for returned checks. The board agreed that the fee should be paid by the member whose check was returned going forward. No one at tonight's meeting voiced an objection to this new policy. Vice President Joan Potter:

"Scent Hearts" is a new guild project for the neonatal unit at Women and Infants Hospital. Five-inch prewashed flannel squares (washed in Free and Clear) have been put into kits for members to make hearts for the parents to transfer their scent to the flannel heart which will then be put in the incubator with the baby. These hearts help with the bonding process and provide comfort for the newborns. Directions will be provided on the website, newsletter, Facebook, and email. Kits can be picked up at Island Creations by Louise. It is important to sew these hearts with clean hands that have no lotion or scented soaps or perfumes on them. The hearts can be turned into Joan at the March meeting.

Joan still needs about 100 more maple leaf blocks for the 2025 raffle quilt. Instructions have been published in the newsletter. Please use a color wheel to select complementary colors for the blocks (opposite sides of the color wheel) and to use different fabrics so there will be a variety of blocks in the quilt (preferably no beige or white). Please mail your blocks to Joan Potter or give them to her at the March meeting.

The 2023 Summer Challenge will coordinate with the Comfort Quilt committee again this year. The finished guilts will be donated to DCYF for children in foster care.
